Maternal Fetal Triage Index (MFTI) - AWHONN

Maternity triage is a broad field that requires high levels accuracy and skill and sometimes teamwork, cooperation and support of triage officers by other colleagues.

The Quality of the Maternity Triage Process: a Qualitative ...

Maternity Triage will see all pregnant women greater than 20 weeks gestation requiring unplanned obstetric or midwifery care. Women who are less than 20 weeks gestation may be seen in Maternity Triage depending upon clinical history or presentation. Exclusion criteria: Active antepartum haemorrhage

Maternity Triage Standard Operating Procedure

The guidelines for levels of clinical urgency and immediate subsequent care were developed using current available evidence, and consensus statements with the agreement of the local maternity team. The initial triage assessment, lasting around five minutes, is completed within 15 minutes of the woman's attendance, and includes the taking of a brief maternal history, completion of baseline maternal observations (temperature, pulse, respirations, blood pressure), assessment of pain levels ...

Maternity Telephone Triage Services

In the Midwife Assessment Triage (Triage), we provide individualised advice and assessment to women in early labour both over the telephone and/or face-to-face. It is staffed by a senior midwife who will ask questions to ensure you and your baby are well. You may or may not be asked to come into hospital. When asked to attend, your care is prioritised according to needs and we aim to see you within 30 minutes.

Triage - Kingston Hospital | Home (Maternity)

The system is based on established triage systems in emergency medicine and uses an assessment

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with clinical prioritisation of the common reasons that present within maternity triage. An initial standardised assessment of each woman identifies her presenting condition, key clinical symptoms and physiological indicators.
