Example Nursing Picot Questions. Using PICO to Formulate Clinical Questions . PICO (alternately known as PICOT) is a mnemonic used to describe the four elements of a good clinical question.It stands for: P-Patient/Problem I-Intervention C-Comparison O-Outcome. Many people find that it helps them clarify their question, which in turn makes it easier to find an answer.

Diagnostic PICOT Question Examples: Is a PKU test (I) done on two week old infants (P) more accurate in diagnosis inborn errors in metabolism (O) compared with PKU tests done at 24 hours of age (C)? Time is implied in two weeks and 24 hours old.

Therapy PICOT Question, a non-intervention example: What is the duration of recovery (O) for patients with total hip replacement (P) who developed a post-operative infection (I) as opposed to those who did not (C) within the first six weeks of recovery (T)?

PICO Question Template Examples. It can be helpful to classify your question based on the clinical domain(s) it falls under. See below for definitions, PICO templates, and example questions from the primary clinical domains: intervention, diagnosis, etiology, prevention, prognosis/prediction, quality of life/meaning, and therapy.

1. Ask: PICO(T) Question - Evidence Based Practice ...

A good PICO will investigate something new in terms of diagnosis, etiology, therapy, harm, etc. A bad PICO is usually a background question disguised as a research question. For example, "what are the effects of Prilosec on patients taking immune suppressants" might seem like a good research question, but it is not.

PICO Framework. Without a well-focused question, it can be very difficult and time consuming to identify appropriate resources and search for relevant evidence. Practitioners of Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) often use a specialized framework, called PICO, to form the question and facilitate the literature search. I PICO stands for:

A simple database search strategy should begin with the AND : cross infection AND (Handwashing OR Hand disinfection) Start with CINAHL or Medline/PubMed as initial article databases for a scoping search for most health sciences questions.If your topic has a behavioral/mental health component, also try PsycINFO. (knowing your search must be in the nursing literature, however.)
